Remember the days when people had Scripture texts on the wall? My grand-mother gave me one when I was a child and it read: "I sought the Lord and He heard me and delivered me from all my fears" Psalm 34.4. I have never forgotten that verse and there have been many times when I have been reminded of its truth.

One such time was when we were walking as a family on the Routeburn Track. A drizzly rain started and it was rather refreshing in the bush at the time. Soon, however, there was a thunderstorm and the rain came down in torrents causing our party to hurry as the guide warned that the rivers rose quickly. They certainly did. Our son, then aged twelve, was swept off his feet as the party attempted to cross a

swiftly flowing stream. The rest of us were not allowed to cross there, so, after ascertaining that he was all right, we detoured to cross where the stream was wider and thus not so dangerous. None of us voiced our fears, but I heard my daughter singing hymns. Yes, in her way she had sought the Lord too. Eventually we were reunited as a family, but not before we had crossed a bridge knee deep in water, and had formed a human chain to wade a waist-deep stream which was usually crossed on stepping stones. It is at times like this when our faith can be tested: but what a comfort to know that in seeking the Lord, we also know His peace. We need never be alone.
