Principal's Tea and Orientation

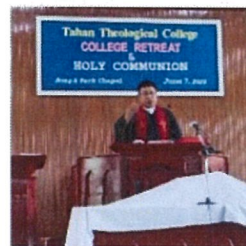
On June 5, 2024 9:00-11:30 a.m. Principal's Tea and Orientation for College students and staff was organized at Song & Park Chapel.

was celebrated thereafter that the college benefited greatly.



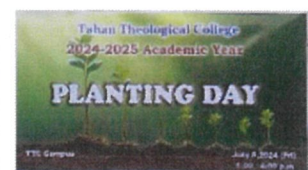
Librarian training
